

"Aerial photographs (four attached) taken late yesterday show groundwater from earthworks at the plant is pouring into the lake and creating a plume of dirtier lake water. "Because the bunds and make-shift emergency ponds the council is making a mess. The new sewage disasters in years, yet Horowhenua Mayor Brendon Duffy is still in denial. He needs to accept there is a major problem and take leadership on it or resign."

Russel Norman gets offside with local council

The Horowhenua District Council has hit back at Green Party allegations that the Levin wastewater treatment plant is leaking into Lake Horowhenua, claiming that Green co-leader Russel Norman is "simply political point scoring".

"It is extremely disappointing that the Greens have chosen to offer wide-ranging criticism, much of it based on speculation rather than fact," HDC chief executive David Ward said.

Mr Ward believes heavy rainfall has pushed the average rainfall levels in July and August past normal.

"While currently the rainfall has ceased, unfortunately there may be further flooding in the future due to the high water levels."

Mr Norman had argued that mayor Brendan Duffy should resign over what he claims is "one of New Zealand's worst scandals", and

Mr Ward rejected the claims and said: "It is important that we acknowledge that the buffer storage ponds hold treated effluent. We are minor users of water."

"The situation that the council is currently facing is outside its control – we are dealing with highest ever recorded groundwater levels," Mr Ward said.

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
